MATERIALS

CCX3104 Coffee Mug Ornament
Detail Brush
Fan Brush
Medium Brush
Character Patterns
NCR Paper or Tissue Paper

COLORS

CMM 67 - Snowflake
CMM 31 - Licorice
CMM 101 - Fresh Heather
CMM 69 - Orange Juice
CMM 14 - Gumdrop
CMM 16 - Chiffon
CCM 39 - Blue Green

CMM 14 - Mocha Java



INSTRUCTIONS

Skull Mug:

- 1. Start by painting the outside of the mug and handle with 3 coats of Chiffon using a fan brush.
- 2. Next, paint the inside of the mug with 3 coats of Orange Juice using a fan brush.
- 3. After the background is dry, use either NCR or the tissue transfer technique to apply the pattern.
- 4. Finally, fill in the face pattern with 3 coats of Licorice using a detail brush.

Pumpkin Mug

- 1. Start by painting the outside of the mug and handle with 3 coats of Carrot Juice using a fan brush.
- 2. Next, paint the inside of the mug with 3 coats of Fresh Heather using a fan brush.
- 3. After the background is dry, use either NCR or the tissue transfer technique to apply the pattern.
- 4. Finally, fill in the details of the pattern with 3 coats of paint using a detail brush. We used Licorice for the eyes and mouth, Gumdrop for the vine, and Mocha Java for the stem.

Frankenstein Mug

- 1.Start by painting the outside of the mug and handle with 3 coats of Gumdrop using a fan brush.
- 2. Next, paint the inside of the mug with 3 coats of Blue Green using a fan brush.
- 3. After the background is dry, use either NCR or the tissue transfer technique to apply the pattern.
- 4. Finally, fill in the details of the pattern with 3 coats of paint using a detail brush. We used Licorice for the face and hair and Blue Green for the scars.

TIPS

- 3 coats of paint will give you nice solid colors for the backgrounds
- Don't be to stressed about the faces being perfect, we are going for cute and quirky
- The harder your push down on the brush, the thicker the line will be. So, on the details keep the brush straight and don't press down to get the finest lines.
